FOR KNOW-IT-ALLS

This route is for those who think they know everything about Narva! And for those who are looking for something new.

Start your walk at the Town Hall Square to see it in an utterly new way. If you come in July or later, you will be able to see Narva's old town in the virtual exhibition in Narva Town Hall. Walk along Rüütli Street to the Dark Garden, go down to the river promenade and walk to the panoramic view of two fortresses - the Narva Castle and the Ivangorod Fortress. These are the only fortifications in the world that are only an arrow flight away across the river from each other.

Walk to the Joaorg Recreation Area, where the promenade now continues. Go up to the "five-krone view" observation deck. Probably you know that one side of Estonian 5-krone banknote featured Paul Keres and the other one - two fortresses. This is exactly that view!

You must be ready to have lunch now, so walk or take a taxi to restaurant Rondeel located in the territory of Narva castle, small and cozy Cafe Bublik on Puškini Street, White Pumpkin on Lavretsovi Street, or Cafe Muna in Narva College of the University of Tartu.

In the evening, you should definitely go on a





nice walk along Puškini Street to Joala Street over the footbridge across the railway. Did you know that one of the first (although not the very first), houses with central heating in Estonia was right here in Kreenholm? And that in 1913 the Narva hospital was already equipped with an elevator? Or that the founder of the Kreenholm Manufacture, Baron von Knoop, is an ancestor of the President of the European Commission, Ursula von der Leyen? Learn even more interesting facts on the Joala themed tour. Look for signs with QR codes this summer.

Those who are looking for an interesting way to spend the evening can go to Narva-Jõesuu on the Caroline riverboat, which departs from the port of Narva at 17.00. The boat ride will take a little over an hour. Once you arrive to Narva-Jõesuu, head to Restaurant Franzia to share your impressions of an eventful day

while enjoying its unforgettable lamprey fish dishes. You can go back to Narva by free shuttle bus, taxi, or riverboat, which departs at 19.00.



DAY IN NARVA

In the summer, you are welcome to visit Narva directly from Narva-Jõesuu. You have several options for traveling to Narva and back: you may take the free local bus or your own car, but our recommendation is to go by the riverboat Caroline. It departs from Narva-Jõesuu harbor at 12:00.

At 13:30, you will arrive at Narva river port, right where the River Promenade starts. If you want to have lunch right away, we recommend the riverside Bar Ro-Ro.

You have other options too:

1 Take a walk on our promenade; you will also meet the locals there. Find one special lion; enjoy the view of the two fortresses, Narva and Ivangorod, which are only an arrow flight away from each other. Enjoy the beauty of Joaorg and go up to the "fivekrone view" observation deck.

By now, you definitely deserve a good lunch, whether it is in the castle restaurant Rondeel, our small cafe Bublik on Puškini Street, the bright cafe White Pumpkin on Lavretsovi Street, or cafe Muna in Narva College.

Start at the promenade, find the lion, enjoy the fortresses, but turn to Raja Street and go to the museum in the castle. This is an exciting opportunity to learn about its history. You can also have lunch in the castle restaurant Rondeel.

On your way back to the boat, be sure to walk across Town Hall Square and along Rüütli Street and go down to the River Promenade along the winding Pimeaia Street. If other ideas have come up in the meantime, you can also return to Narva-Jõesuu by bus.

The riverboat Caroline departs for Narva-Jõesuu at 17:00. The ride lasts a little over an hour. Enjoy the amazing view of the Narva River's delta.

We invite you to take a walk in Narva, with at least 15,000 steps guaranteed. We start and finish at Peetri Square.

Start your walk from Peetri Square to Town Hall Square, where the new city square and the renovated town hall await. What an amazing sight! Go along Rüütli Street and walk on the upper Promenade. The first photo to be taken is by the fountain in the Dark Darden, which has a similar predecessor from the mid-19th century. It is the spot where most of Narva's family photos are taken. The next photo is a view of the two fortresses. From there, go down Mayor Hahn's

Walk north and see what is going on in the harbor. Walk back, enjoy the view of the two fortresses, and go to the Joaorg Recreation Area, where the promenade was extended. Go up to the "five-krone view" observation deck. Probably you know that one side of Estonian 5-krone banknote featured Paul Keres and the other one - two fortresses. This is exactly that view! Admire Estonia's largest churches, the Alexander's Cathedral and the Resurrection of Christ Orthodox Cathedral.

You have already completed at least 6,000 steps and now it is time for lunch. We recommend Alex Cafe in the building of the former secret military factory "Baltijets".

In the afternoon, take a walk over the pedestrian bridge between Puškini and Joala streets to Kreenholm. Did you know that one of the first (although not the very first) houses with central

You have two options at the end of Joala Street. Either keep walking to Kulgu harbor and admire the views of the Narva reservoir, the ash mountains, or "Narva Venice," or return back to Narva, again over the footbridge. Did you know that in fact, about 100 years ago, Narva and Kreenholm were separate cities?

In Kulgu you will have completed at least 10,000 steps. Congratulations! You can call a taxi to pick you up. If you return directly from Kreenholm to the city, your smart device will show approx. 15,000 steps.

At 10:00 in the morning or later: visit the Narva Museum. This is no ordinary city museum. The castle itself is a "frame" for the exposition, a part of it. The museum is also exciting for children. The cartoon about the history of Narva will not leave anyone without a smile on their face.

After visiting the museum, you definitely deserve a good lunch, whether it is in the castle restaurant Rondeel, our small cafe Bublik on Puškini Street, the bright cafe White Pumpkin on Lavretsovi Street, or cafe Muna in Narva College.

In the afternoon we invite you to take a walk to Town Hall Square and the Old Town, the





Dark Garden, and the promenade. Walk along Rüütli Street and imagine what it would be like for a piece of Old Town to be restored.
